

Year 4 Summer 2

<u>Topic Overview -</u> In this unit, children will first learn when and what the 4 main periods of Ancient Greece were. Then, they will build an understanding of the lasting impact of the Ancient Greeks on: democracy, architecture, art, mathematical and scientific thinking, culture and literature. A major focus will be the city states of Sparta and Athenea as children learn about the Athenians and Spartans in detail and their ongoing wars. Finally, they will examine how the Ancient Greek Empire expanded through invasions and conquests by Alexander the Great.

Our Learning Overview Who Let the Gods Out? - We will be writing stories based a famous Greek myth and create an information text about the Greeks with an Olympics past and present focus. English Furthermore, children will use their mythical stories to support their understanding of different writing features and grammar rules. This term we will continue looking at the 4 operations using formal methods and using these methods to complete two-step problems. Children will also learn about time, shape, Maths money, position and direction. To understand properties, position and direction of shapes and gain a secure understanding. Sound: - In this topic, year four will be investigating sound including how sounds are Our Values made, how sounds travels and what pitch, volume, amplitude, and vibration are in Science Who Let the relation to sound. Teamwork Who let the Gods Out: - The children will learn about the Greek civilisation and its Respect impact on the modern world. Then, in detail, they will examine the Athenians and <u>History</u> Honesty Spartans and their battles before investigating the achievements of Alexander the Great. Pride Greek Vases and coins: - In this term, children will be looking at Ancient Greek vases and begin to design and create their own 3D forms using clay and/or paper mâché, thinking Art carefully about shape and form. Creativity and Curiosity- In PHSE, we will be looking at different art mediums and works PHSE/RE to discuss creativity. In RE, children explore the concept of life as a journey. They will be able to describe what happens in Chrisitan, Jewish and Hindu ceremonies of commitment and compare similarities and differences between these faiths in Britain today.
