








Year 4 showed maturity and teamwork when we moved classrooms. They worked sensibly and we are proud of them.

Secondary school places - Kent County Council

You can apply for up to 4 schools.

- Put the schools in the order of preference.
- It's in your best interest to list 4 schools.
- Naming only one school does not guarantee your child a place at that school or give priority for a place over another child.
- You are not able to name the same school more than once.
